January 22, 2010 – The Hiding Place (1975, directed by James F. Collier). Based on a true story, this gripping drama follows Corrie Ten Boom and her family in World War II-era Holland. When the Nazis discover the family has been sheltering Jews in their small home they must face a true test of their faith.

February 26, 2010 – The Great Debaters (2007, directed by Denzel Washington) Denzel Washington starts in his directorial debut in the true story of a professor in Texas in 1935 and the all-black school's first debate team.
Presented to honor African American History Month.

March 26, 2010 – Real Women Have Curves (2002, directed by Patricia Cardoso) A timely coming of age story about a first generation Latina who struggles to balance her family's culture with her own hopes and dreams.
Presented to honor Women's History Month.

April 23, 2010 – Bonhoeffer (2003, directed by Martin Doblemeier). This poignant documentary traces the life of German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who was one of the first to speak up against Adolph Hitler.

May 28, 2010 – The Namesake (2006, directed by Mira Nair). American-born Gogol, the son of Indian immigrants, wants to fit in among his fellow New Yorkers, despite his family's unwillingness to let go of their traditional ways.
Presented to honor Asian-American History Month.

June 25, 2010 – Rabbit-Proof Fence (2002, directed by Phillip Noyce). In 1930's Australia, three aboriginal girls escape after being plucked from their homes to be trained as domestic staff and set off on a trek across the Outback.

July 23, 2010 - Duma (2004, directed by Carroll Ballard). This family drama explores the bonds of friendship between man and beast. A young boy befriends a cheetah named Duma, and must traverse the southern region of Africa, a long and difficult journey, just so he can help his pal return to his one true home -- the wild.

August 27, 2010 – Flow: For the Love of Water (2008 directed by Irena Salina). An in-depth look into the troubling privatization and distribution of water on a world-wide scale.

September 24, 2010 – The Secret of Roan Inish (1995, directed by John Sayles). Sent to live with her grandparents in a quaint coastal Irish town, 10-year-old Fiona is fascinated by the local culture, particularly myths about a half-human, half-seal creature known as a selkie.

October 22, 2010 – Lemon Tree (2008, directed by Eran Riklis). A Palestinian widow fights to keep her lemon grove from being uprooted when Israeli security forces declare it a threat to the Israeli defense minister living next door. This foreign-language drama is based on a true story.
